Alberta Health Services

- ▶ 3.6 Million Canadians live with at least one neurological condition (Mapping Connections, 2014)
- ▶ Account for more than half of people requiring continuing care (home and long term care)
- ▶ National economic burden expressed was \$179B (2001 data report, Public Health Agency)
- ▶ Highest prevalence excluding stroke and migraines attributed to 6 Neuro conditions: 650,000 Canadians (2010,2011 Canadian Community Health Care)
- ▶ Conservative estimate in AB 75,000 (2010,2011 Canadian Community Health Care)

- ▶ PD will double by 2031 from 10,000 to 20,000

INTEGRATED APPROACH

- ▶ Medical liaison: Navigator
- ▶ One referral from medical or allied health model (AH, AHS)
- ▶ Triage call: PD, MS, SCI etc
- ▶ Call to relevant organization for patient service delivery
- ▶ Organization/s provide case management, determine HR and financial capacity.
- ▶ Partners: ANN partners collaborate to ensure mental, physical and emotional wellbeing.
